Local author Sue Johnson hosts an informal gathering of local writers and readers. great opportunity networking, swapping ideas,or just enjoying a chat and a cuppa!



When she was later found at a luxury hotel in Harrogate, the author claimed to be suffering from amnesia and remembered nothing. Neither the press nor the police believed her.... 
Fifty not out: The six sixes revisited


