



EVESHAM FESTIVAL OF WORDS 2020

Welcome to the first **Evesham Festival of Words Haiku Competition** - open to all published and unpublished, UK and non-UK based writers.

Launch date: **Thursday 1st October 2020**

Closing date: **5pm, Monday 30th November 2020.**

Theme: Winter.

Fee: £5 for a maximum of four entries.

Entrants: The Competition is open to anyone over the age of 16.

Judges: Sue Johnson and Jan Dawson

Prizes: 1st prize - £70; 2nd prize - £40; 3rd prize - £20.

DEFINITION OF HAIKU

A haiku is a Japanese poem of 17 syllables, usually presented in three lines – 5, 7, 5. Here are three examples of haiku poems from Matsuo Basho (1644-1694), considered the greatest haiku poet:

An old silent pond...
A frog jumps into the pond,
splash! Silence again.

Autumn moonlight-
a worm digs silently
into the chestnut.

In the twilight rain
these brilliant-hued hibiscus -
A lovely sunset.

A lot of the modern haiku writers do deviate from the traditional form - so the words are presented in two lines rather than three. For this Competition we require traditional haiku entries in three lines.



HAIKU COMPETITION 2020 – RULES

Haiku must be the original work of the entrant and should not be previously published, self-published, published online, broadcast, or won a prize in another competition.

Simultaneous submissions are allowed, but please let us know as soon as possible if a haiku is to be published elsewhere, or wins a prize in another competition.

If submitting more than one entry, each haiku must be on a separate sheet, but all submitted in the same email.

Entries must be typed, preferably in 12 font.

The name of the author and any other identifying information must not appear on the haiku, but in the accompanying email.

Once entered, the haiku cannot be amended.

Copyright will remain with the author, but the organisers reserve the right to publish any of the prizewinning haiku they deem appropriate.

Members of the Festival Steering Group, or the Judges, will not be eligible to enter the Competition.

Entries must be received by the deadline of **5pm on Monday 30th November 2020**. Entries received after this date/time will not be considered.

Entries will be judged anonymously, so please ensure that haiku do not contain any identifying information.

How to submit your entry:

All entries must be submitted electronically. Note that entries that do not comply with the Rules will be disqualified.

Include the title of your haiku as a header.

If submitting more than one entry, each haiku must be on a separate sheet, but all submitted in the same email.

Entries should be submitted by email to: info@eveshamfestivalofwords.org. Haiku should be doc, doc.x or PDF format. Please include in the email your name, address and contact telephone number. (Any problems with Festival email, please send to sueablett1@btinternet.com). Do not send your entry in the body of an email.



Online payment of the entry fee should be made via Paypal from the Festival website – www.eveshamfestivalofwords.org/Competition.

Your payment will be processed securely by Paypal. After you have made your payment you will receive a confirmation email from Paypal. That email will quote a transaction ID number. Please ensure you quote that number in the email with your entry/entries.

An acknowledgement will be sent by the Competition Coordinator on receipt of your entry.

If you are unable, or do not wish, to make payment online, please send a cheque for the value of the entry fee, payable to 'Evesham Festival of Words' to 20 Allardene, Evesham, Worcs. WR11 1EA. Please include your name and the title of your haiku with your cheque.

Entries will only be accepted for judging when payment has been received.

Please contact us by email (info@eveshamfestivalofwords.org) at any time up to the closing date if you wish to withdraw your entry. No refund will be given for any withdrawn entries.

Judging:

Entries will be read and judged anonymously: entrants names and contact details must not appear on the haiku.

There will be two judges: **Sue Johnson** and **Jan Dawson**, both of whom will read all submitted haiku.

The judges will select a shortlist of 10, and from those a winner, 2nd and 3rd.

Judges will not comment or give feedback on individual haiku.

The Judges' decision is final and no individual correspondence will be entered into.

In the event of either of the named judges being unable to carry out judging, an alternative will be identified.

Prizes:

There will be cash prizes of £70, £40 and £20 for 1st, 2nd and 3rd.

There will not be a prizegiving event. All entrants, including the winner, 2nd and 3rd will be notified by email, within two weeks of the closing date at the latest, and posted on the Festival website.

The winner, 2nd and 3rd, will be invited to have their haiku published on the Festival website.



About the Judges:

Jan Dawson – is a retired ex-librarian, and has been involved in the West Midland’s poetry scene for a number of years. She has organised poetry slams and open mics, informal poetry readings with numerous poets, and poetry book launches. She has been a judge for Poetry on Loan competitions, and is a member of their steering group. She has also been part of Warwickshire Libraries’ Young Poet Laureate scheme from the beginning, being instrumental in setting this up, and judging the competition for the last five years.

Sue Johnson - Sue Johnson is published as a poet, short story writer and novelist. Most of her ideas begin as poems. Since 1st January 2013 she has written a poem a day. Many of them have been published in small press magazines both in the UK and the US. Sue's work is inspired by the natural world, fairytales and eavesdropping in cafes. She has published three full poetry collections and two joint collections. Sue runs her own brand of workshops in various locations. She is also a Writing Magazine Creative Writing Tutor for Poetry and four of their other programmes.
